ORDER OF DETENTION PENDING TRIAL

THIS CAUSE coming on to be heard upon the agreed motion of the parties to detain the defendant, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3142, and this Court having heard argument on this matter, the Court hereby finds:

1. Defendant has been charged in a one-count information alleging that he conspired to conduct the affairs of an organized crime enterprise, known as the Chicago Outfit, with other persons known and unknown, through a pattern of racketeering that included extortion, murder, and other criminal acts.

2. The defendant is currently serving a 70-month sentence imposed upon his conviction in the Northern District of Illinois for violations of 18 U.S.C. §§ 371, 894, and 1962(d). This term of incarceration is scheduled to expire on or about November 5, 2002.

3. The defendant has indicated with advice of counsel that, at the present time, he wishes to forgo any petition for release pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142, and instead wishes to remain in federal custody after the expiration of his current federal sentence pending the resolution of the charges in this matter. The defendant wishes to preserve his right to later seek release pending trial pursuant to §3142 should he later deem it to be in

his interests to do so.

Having considered the arguments of the parties,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 3142(e), that defendant Nicholas W. Calabrese remain in custody until the resolution of this case.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that he shall be returned by the United States Marshal to the federal institution where he is currently serving the remainder of his federal sentence. Upon completion of this sentence, the defendant shall remain in the pretrial custody of the United States Marshal and the United States Bureau of Prisons, in an institution deemed to be appropriate for the defendant's continued incarceration pending the resolution of this case.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that defendant shall be afforded reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his counsel.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that upon order of the United States District Court or on request of an attorney of the government, the Bureau of Prisons and the United States Marshal shall transport the defendant for the purpose of an appearance in connection with a court proceeding.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order of detention pending trial is entered without prejudice to the defendant's right to later seek an order of release pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order be sealed and impounded until further Order of Court, except that a copy of this Order may be provided to an appropriate representative of the United States

Bureau of Prisons and the United States Marshal as necessary to effectuate the continued custody of the defendant.
